Topic words	
Myth	A story from ancient times, especially one that was told to explain natural events or to describe the early history of a people.
Legend	A story from ancient times about people and events that may or may not be true.
King & Queen	A male/female ruler of an independent state that has a royal family
Castle	A large strong building with thick high walls and towers, built in the past by kings or queens, or other important people, to defend themselves against attack.
St George	The national saint of England. According to the legend, he killed a dragon to save a woman.
King Arthur	A king of England. There are many stories about King Arthur, e.g. that he pulled his sword Excalibur from a stone, and that he sat with his knights at a Round Table.
Robin Hood	A person who takes or steals money from rich people and gives it to poor people
