I can find Kenya on a map.	<p>Africa - is the second biggest continent in the world.</p> <p>Continent - is an area of land that is made up of lots of different countries.</p> <p>Map - A picture showing an area of land or sea.</p> <p>Native - A plant or animal belonging to that place.</p> <p>Habitat - A home of an animal or plant.</p> <p>Rainforest - A type of habitat with tall trees, warm climates, and lots of rain.</p> <p>Climate - Weather over a long period of time.</p> <p>Savanna - A type of habitat with grassland and some trees. Savanna's have a dry season where wildfires are common.</p> <p>Desert - A type of habitat that is very large and get very little rain each year.</p> <p>Kenya - A country in East Africa.</p> <p>Congo Basin - In central Africa. It is the largest rainforest in Africa.</p> <p>Kalahari Desert - Southern Africa. Gets very little rain.</p>
