Kenya	A country in East Africa.
Africa	One of the seven continents.
city	A large town where many people live and work.
climate	The usual weather of a place over a long period of time.
wildlife	Animals living in their natural habitats.
export	A product sold to another country.

How is life in Kenya like and different from life in the United Kingdom?



Lessons in this unit:

Lesson 1: To know that Kenya is a country in Africa near the Equator and next to the Indian Ocean.

Lesson 2: To know that Kenya has a range of human and physical features, including cities, forests, mountains and deserts.

Lesson 3: To know that Kenya is home to a variety of wildlife living in different habitats

Lesson 4: To know that Kenya is usually hotter than the United Kingdom because it is near the Equator and has different seasons.

Lesson 5: To know that life in Kenya and the United Kingdom has similarities and differences, including homes, jobs and transport.

Lesson 6: To know that Kenya and the United Kingdom have different climates, landscapes, wildlife and ways of life.

Endpoint Outcome: To create a comparison poster or booklet that explains how life in Kenya is like and different from life in the United Kingdom.
