

Vocabulary	
War	A conflict between countries or groups.
Blitz	A period of bombing attacks on British cities during World War Two.
evacuation	Moving people from a place of danger to somewhere safer.
evacuee	A person who has been moved from a place of danger to somewhere safer.
ration	A fixed amount of food or supplies allowed during a shortage.
Nazi	A member of a political group led by Adolf Hitler in Germany.
Civilian	A person who is not in the army or fighting the war.
Impact	The effect something has on people's lives.

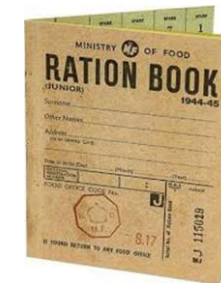
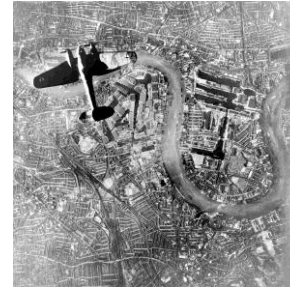

**Links to the NC:**

H2.1 – Chronological understanding: Pupils sequence key events of WWII (e.g. outbreak of war, Blitz, VE Day) and develop a clear sense of when these happened. H2.2 – Timeline and connections: Pupils place key events, countries and figures within a broader historical timeline and begin to see how they are connected. H2.5 – Cause, consequence and impact: Pupils explain the causes of WWII and understand the impact of events such as the Blitz, evacuation and rationing on people's lives, comparing past and present. H2.7 – Historical enquiry and evidence: Pupils use a range of sources (photos, diaries, accounts, artefacts) to investigate the past and answer questions about life in WWII.

# Changes World War II

## How did World War Two change the lives of people in Britain?



**Lessons in this unit:**

- Lesson 1 – Causes of World War II – LO: To understand the main causes of World War II.
  - Lesson 2 – Countries and Sides in WWII – LO: To identify the countries involved in WWII and the sides they belonged to.
  - Lesson 3 – The Blitz – LO: To understand what the Blitz was and its impact on people in Britain.
  - Lesson 4 – Evacuation of Children – LO: To understand why children were evacuated and how it affected their lives.
  - Lesson 5 – Rationing and Civilian Life – LO: To understand how rationing and war affected daily life in Britain.
  - Lesson 6 – Victory in Europe and the End of WWII – LO: To understand how WWII ended and what happened after the war.
- Endpoint Summary:**  
Pupils create a historical news report, diary, or video explaining how World War Two changed the lives of people in Britain. They must include the Blitz, evacuation, and rationing, use historical evidence (e.g. photos, accounts, facts), and clearly explain the impact on people's lives, ending with a final answer to the enquiry question.
