Florence Nightingale	A nurse who improved hospitals and cared for soldiers.
Louis Braille	The creator of a reading system for blind people.
Rosa Parks	A woman who stood up for equal rights by refusing to give up her seat on a bus.
source	Something that tells us about the past (e.g. objects, pictures, writing).
change	When something becomes different.
significance	How important something is in history.
past	Something that has already happened.
present	What is happening now.

### In Early Years I learned about:

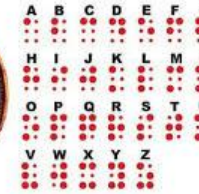
- We learned about the difference between the **past** and the **present**.
