

Vocabulary

Fabric	A material made by weaving, knitting or bonding fibres together
Template	A shape used as a guide when making something.
Running stitch	A simple sewing stitch made by passing a needle in and out of fabric.
Sew	To join fabric together using a needle and thread.
Decorate	To add colour, pattern or detail to improve the appearance of something.
Bunting	A line of decorated fabric flags joined together for display.
