sculpture	A piece of art that is made in three dimensions.
sculptor	An artist who creates sculptures.
natural	Found in nature and not made by people.
texture	How something feels or looks like it feels.
arrange	To place objects carefully into a pattern or design.
join	To connect two or more materials together.
